Politics and Power (POL)

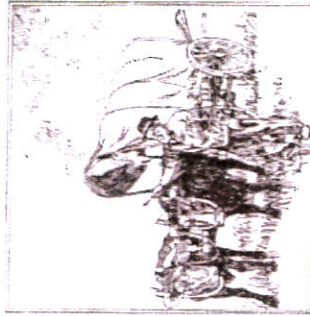
How have Americans agreed or disagreed over the values that guide our political system as well as who is part of the political process?

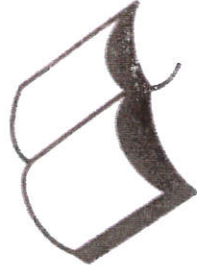
Peopling (PEO)

How have people who have willingly and unwillingly moved to, from, and within the US's changing borders adapted to their social and physical environments?



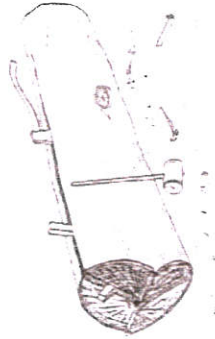
America and the World (WOR)
